

For many employees, the project provided a chance to express how they see themselves and the value they bring to our workplace.


We thank every supported employee who contributed their artwork and their voice to this celebration.




The Race That Stops A Nation






Honouring Service & Sacrifice

Virtual Reality Therapy

Using virtual reality as an aid in therapy and behaviour management

Over the past few months, our Bayswater aged care sites have been given the opportunity to use Virtual Reality (VR) equipment in therapy and behavioural management.

VR is used in aged care to combat loneliness and isolation, improve cognitive and physical health, and enhance quality of life by providing immersive experiences.

For those with dementia, VR can be a tool for reminiscence therapy, triggering positive memories by recreating historical events or past environments, and can be used to provide new experiences.

Residents were offered the opportunity to trial VR experiences aimed at promoting engagement, relaxation, reminiscence, enjoyment, and behaviour management. A variety of virtual environments were explored, including travel destinations, animal encounters, underwater scenes, and music therapy.

At Bayswater, the VR programme demonstrated strong potential for enhancing engagement, reminiscence, and emotional well-being among residents. We found that VR was particularly effective for anxiety reduction and sensory stimulation when used with sensitivity to resident preferences and comfort.

VR will continue to be used for therapy during one-on-one sessions and small groups.





Safety Month Initiative

A new safety initiative with a different focus each month

At Alinea we take Health and Safety very seriously and, whilst we already carry out monthly Work, Health and Safety (WHS) checks at all of our sites, we have commenced a 'Focus of the Month.'

These monthly themes are designed either to reinforce current checks in greater detail or to draw attention to seasonal risks and emerging hazards that may arise throughout the year. By shining a spotlight on one issue at a time, we help build a proactive safety culture where staff feel confident recognising - and addressing - potential risks early.

We have recently covered (to name a few):

- Ladder compliance - ensuring all step ladders at every site now meet legislative requirements.
- Electrical power board and extension lead safety.
- Dehydration - particularly as the hot weather approaches.

Upcoming topics will include:

- Bushfire preparedness and actions to take if you are caught in one.
- Snake safety.

Beyond the immediate benefits, initiatives like this play an important role in strengthening overall organisational wellbeing. A strong safety culture not only prevents injuries but also improves morale, reduces workplace stress, and supports consistent service delivery for the people we serve. Many organisations now recognise that WHS is not just a compliance exercise - it's a foundation

for a healthy, supportive, and productive workplace.

Depending on the topic, there may be a training session at the sites, but regardless, all staff are emailed a copy of an information sheet. The content is practical and useful in everyday life, meaning these safety tips can support staff and their families at home just as much as they do at work.

Four Decades of Dedication

A toast to two of our longest-serving employees

In 2025, ParaQuad Industries is proud to celebrate the incredible milestone of two longstanding team members: Susan Baker and Ruth Cresswell. Ruth marks an extraordinary 45 years with the organisation, having begun her journey in April 1980 at just 17 years old. Susan joined shortly after in May 1981 at the age of 18. While the workplaces evolved dramatically over four decades, both Susan and Ruth say they remain as happy as ever to be part of the ParaQuad family.

ParaQuad Industries was originally located in Osborne Park before relocating to Shenton Park shortly after Susan commenced. Both women fondly remembered the many managers, supervisors, and colleagues who have passed through during their long service. They still speak warmly of the first manager, Wally Johnson, and his wife Josie, who drove the ParaQuad bus to shuttle supported employees between the Perth Bus Station and the Osborne Park warehouse.

In their early days, Susan and Ruth both worked together in the Cloth section. Ruth later moved to the Cafe where she has been ever since. Susan briefly worked in Cleaning before returning to Cloth, where she now acts as a supportive guide for the new supported employees. Their memories include an incredible range of past ParaQuad activities from woodworking and upholstery to gardening, car detailing, and printing. Susan even recalls the swimming pool that once stood where the Book Bazaar is today. One of the most significant events in their time was the devastating 2012 electrical fire that



destroyed the old ParaQuad building. Ruth vividly remembers walking to work and meeting colleagues heading in the opposite direction who told her the building was gone. She didn't believe them until she saw the fire engines herself. Supported employees and their sections relocated to the Administration building until the new facility was completed.

Christmas has always been a joyful occasion for supported employees. Both Susan and Ruth remember one especially memorable celebration when every supported employee received a Walkman - and Ruth still has hers! For Ruth and Susan, the best part of their job is the people working together, supporting one another and feeling part of a positive community.

Susan says that ParaQuad Industries is truly a second home. Ruth says that it's a great place to work where everyone gets along so well.
